#### **DECEMBER 2018**

**Leadership Meeting Minutes: November 12-14, 2018** 

Vision for Planning: Sister Marilyn has been working on the program for unfolding the planning meeting. Jane Buse-Miller is creating an attractive visual of the whole plan as developed with Carol Crepeau, CSJ. Time was spent looking at the individual components of the community gathering December 8, 2018. The individual sections devoted to the "promises" will be further developed during the December 3-7 team meeting. Carol Crepeau, CSJ, from LaGrange, Illinois, has been engaged to work with the community during the summer 2019 Community Days on July 18-20, 2019.

**Border Service:** Sister Marilyn will prepare an invitation for sisters and associates. We will send \$7,500 from the donation of \$10,000 that was sent earlier for the needs of those at the border. The balance will be used for those who are able to travel to the border to offer service. If no one can travel, we will forward the balance of the donation to border needs.

**Security Systems:** We recommend that Jean Lange research security cameras for the entrances of the motherhouse. The sisters will be notified about the updating of security.

**Formation:** We will work on developing a process for the renewal of the formation program. We will begin this process by having a conversation with a gathering of sisters. A facilitator, Ann Letourneau, CSJ, has been recommended because of her credentials and experience.

**Gift Shop:** Sister Annette Skyles is resigning from managing the gift shop. She reminds us that the shop was initiated when Sister Basil Taylor thought selling cards at Mount Loretto would save sisters trips out to buy cards. We will evaluate the future of the shop.

**Ceramic Kiln:** A buyer is interested in the kiln. She will be given an option to purchase. Sister Rita will talk to Sister Dolores Zieser about whether the kiln works or has been used lately. Before it is sold, we want to be sure it works.

**Riverboat Museum:** Sister Rita will talk to Jean about a community membership.

**Social media:** Jane will organize an event that will be presented by an outside consultant on December 5 for administrative staff.

**Presentation Conference:** Committee on Formation is putting together resources on charism, etc. for North American congregational employees. A gathering might happen with Presentation people from Conference members in the future as a way to reinforce commitment to the charism of Nano.

**Pilgrimage:** We will gather information for the possibility of planning an event in the future – not before 2020. Sister Marilyn is willing to gather a committee.

**Region X LCWR Report:** Sister Marilyn attended the fall meeting in St. Louis. The Iowa members will be invited to join in a "Pray for a state legislator" campaign. Sister Corine Murray will be asked to organize this. Racism will continue to focus on both the regional and the national agenda. The Iowa members will gather in Dubuque on February 28, 2019, at Mount Carmel.

**Resource Center for Religious Institutes Meeting:** Sisters Carmen and Rita reported on workshops and keynote speakers from the fall meeting held October 29-31, 2018. They will be purchasing recordings of the most helpful workshops.

**Southdown Institute Workshop:** In October, Sister Carmen attended a meeting on critical personnel issues. She shared the PowerPoints from the meeting.

**Sisters' Policy Book:** We will begin working through Section 1 at the December meeting. As we complete the revisions to the "book," they will be added to the website.

**Christmas Party for Staff:** The three in Dubuque will investigate cupcakes from a local specialist. We will focus on celebrating the staff as STARS. Sister Joy will ask Sister Paula Schwendinger to create clever titles for candies that will be put into starry bags for each person. Sister Carmen will ask Sister St. James Lickteig to create a table decoration using the theme of stars.

Leadership will extend an invitation to Mery Cary Paz to travel to Dubuque in December to visit with sisters here and on mission.

The Corporate Board met with Sister Lynn Marie (Faye) Fangman, treasurer, on November 12, 2018.

Recently I read an issue of *InFormation*, the quarterly bulletin of the Religious Formation Conference (RFC). The particular focus was lifelong formation, and in her article, "Ongoing Formation for the Whole," Sister Ellen Dauwer, SC (executive director of RFC) offers helpful definitions of formation and ongoing/lifelong formation along with challenging insights.

#### She writes:

Formation is a continuous conversion of heart that involves the whole person in a lifelong process of change and growth. Conversely, formation is not the mere communication of some particular content within a specific timeframe ...

Ongoing/lifelong formation focuses on the continual growth of the whole person to promote a deeper, fuller commitment ... Initial formation is a part of (not apart from) ongoing formation. (RFC InFormation, Summer 2018)

I believe we quite naturally hear the word "formation" and think initial formation, the process of discernment and incorporation beginning prior to entrance up to the final profession of vows.

Sister Ellen challenges us to consider ongoing formation from this wider perspective and cites the tasks of both initial and this broader formation as "reflection, discernment, and integration." We are called to embody these tasks throughout our lives. What is required in response is "openness, freedom and flexibility?" Individual growth in these tasks and one's response contributes to the revitalization of the whole congregation. In conclusion, Sister Ellen offers a valuable list of ongoing formation resources.

The remainder of this issue of *InFormation* includes brief articles about how three different congregations put into practice these tasks of ongoing formation in creative and inclusive ways.
